OA Brotherhood

1. Scout has been an Ordeal member at least 10 months since their induction into the Order of the Arrow.
2. Has maintained registration in the Boy Scouts of America.
3. Has maintained registration and current dues in the Order of the Arrow.
4. Has memorized the Obligation, OA official song, Admonition, Arrow hand clasp and the sign of the Order.
5. Write a letter or take part in an oral Brotherhood talk to test your understanding of the Ordeal and to show why you feel you are prepared for the Brotherhood.
6. If you write a letter – Explain what you think the Obligation means. Describe how you are fulfilling the obligation in your troop or crew in your daily life and how you have used your understanding of the Ordeal to aid in your service to scouting and the lodge. Describe your specific plans for giving future service to the lodge and scouting.

LODGE DUES

Your Lodge Dues run by the Calendar Year. We are asking all members to please check and make sure you have paid your 2019 Lodge dues. 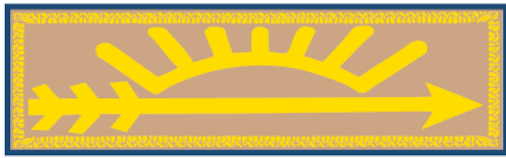

NEW POLICY FOR ARROW OF LIGHT/ CUB SCOUT CROSSOVERS!!!!



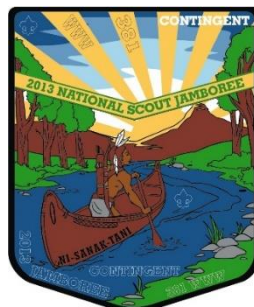
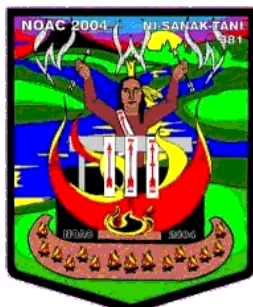
We know that lodges and chapters are frequently asked to perform Arrow of Light and crossover ceremonies for Cub Scout packs, which is an appropriate service in support of our packs. That said, Scouts BSA have received many complaints surrounding these ceremonies from various American Indian tribes due to the manner in which they are conducted, as well as the inconsistent nature in which they are performed. Beginning JANUARY 1, 2019, lodges and chapters that are asked to conduct Arrow of Light or crossover ceremonies for Cub Packs will ONLY be permitted to conduct them using the new approved official ceremonies which can be found in the OA inductions portal (/resources/inductions). These ceremonies are to be in SCOUT UNIFORM WITH YOUR SASH and are NO LONGER PERMITTED TO BE DONE IN AMERICAN INDIAN REGALIA!

PATCH DESIGN

Help design a patch for Ni-Sanak-Tani! The lodge is planning to create a segment patch in 2020 with a different piece for each lodge event, in addition to the 2020 NOAC flap set. Submit your idea to the Scout Office, attn: OA, or email to oa@gatewayareacouncil.org. See the information on patch requirements below.

"Flap" Design *REQUIRES*:

- a) Either "BSA" or the Fleur-de-lis (the more well hidden, the neater the design... look over NOAC Chief's right shoulder).
- b) The NST Totem (Canoe); some designs include the old Braves of Decorah Totem (spoon).
- c) "Ni-Sanak-Tani" and "381"



Optional, but highly encouraged:

d) "WWW" or "<-WWW-<<<" arrow

e) Event Name and Year

f) Space and placement for "Contingent" legend

Design can be either the Flap-alone, or the Flap/Pocket

combination. If a combination, each part needs the Lodge Number "381" (and Event Name/Year) so it can be identified if separated from it's other piece(s).

Design should be fairly colorful, but the more threads the pricier it is. As a gauge, the NOAC 2004 example is 13 colors; the Jambo 2010 set is 9 colors. Use of Photo chromatic (changes in sunlight) or GlowInTheDark threads add 15% to the overall cost but can be effective!

Describe multiple versions, e.g., Ghost/Blood/Night (all one thread color, white/red/black, but patterns and stitch orientation reveals the design!), and distinction(s) between Contingent (gold border) and Traders (black border).

Merrow (edge stitching) can edge every piece (Jambo 2010), or the design can be "seamless" across the parts (NOAC 2004).

For the NOAC flap set, the design must be exactly the shape of the pocket/flap. No extra shapes. For a segment patch, the shape of the patches when put together can vary. For example, the last segment patch in 2009 was the shape of a Native American in a canoe.

>>Can't draw well?... scratch it out, even black & white, and write up a description. The patch company art department will clean it up for us.

LODGE ELECTIONS

Lodge elections will take place August 17, 2019 – on Saturday night of our Rendezvous weekend at Camp Decorah. We will be electing FIVE officers during our lodge meeting. Those positions will be: Lodge Chief, Lodge Vice Chief (Administration), Lodge Vice Chief (Finance), Lodge Vice Chief (Communication), Lodge Vice Chief (Ceremonies).

Those running for election must be registered in Scouting and be active members of the Lodge, under the age of 21. Officers are elected by the members of the Lodge. Ballots will be cast and counted by the Lodge chief, with assistance from advisors.

The term of office is one year and runs from September 1, 2019 through August 31, 2020.

LODGE OFFICER RESPONSIBILITIES

LODGE CHIEF

1. Responsible for the adherence of the Lodge to the policies of the Order of the Arrow as set forth by the National Committee.
2. Sets agendas and presides over all Lodge Executive Committee and general membership meetings, which includes Ordeal weekends, wing ding, Rendezvous, Spook-o-Ree, lodge banquet, conclaves, council meetings etc.

3. Provides training and advice to officers and committee chairmen.
4. With the help of the advisors, appoints committee chairmen for all committees. Is responsible to see that each committee is properly functioning.
5. Oversees the performance of the Vice chiefs of Finance, Ceremonies, Administrative and Communications.
6. With the help of the vice chiefs----sets and works on Lodge goals and achievements. Monitors all committees throughout the year to make sure reports are kept on whether goals have been achieved or what the issues may be.
7. Presents the lodge annual report to the Council by December 31 of each year.
8. Creates, oversees and coordinates special committees as needed, with the aid of the advisors.
9. Represents the lodge at all Section Council of Chiefs meetings, council Executive Board meetings and Council camping Committee meetings.
10. Oversees the performance of District chapter chiefs and their programs.
11. Helps create and monitor camp promotions, troop elections, promotions etc.
12. Responsible for overseeing the maintaining of the Lodge Operations Guide, Lodge handbook and proposing of amendments to the lodge rules.
13. Additional duties as outlined in the latest edition of the ORDER OF THE ARROW HANDBOOK, or by the Gateway Area council.
14. Sets the example by attending lodge events, chapter events, council events, regional events in proper uniform.

VICE CHIEF FOR ADMINISTRATION

1. In consultation with the Lodge Chief and the advisors shall be responsible for the program and promotion of the lodge and ideals of the Order.
2. Is responsible for helping to keep accurate and up to date memberships records, both active and in active.
3. Will help with transfers, dues notices, drop notices, Brotherhood and Vigil eligibility notices and records.
4. Will make membership reports at meetings and banquets.
5. Will help with Smoke Signal articles and publication of the lodge handbook etc.
6. Will hand out and record distribution of registration cards and books to all candidates and members.
7. Is responsible for all duties delegated by the Lodge Chief, advisors or Executive committee.

VICE CHIEF FOR FINANCE

1. In consultation with the Lodge Chief and the advisors shall be responsible for keeping accurate and itemized record for all income and expenses of the lodge.
2. Helps prepare the annual budget for the lodge.
3. Presents audits for all necessary records of monies received and spent throughout the year.

4. Responsible for records pertaining to all lodge items in stock, ordered, sold at the council office, lodge events or camp.
5. Works with administration for records of active and in-active members.
6. Will help with smoke signal articles and publications.
7. Is responsible for all duties delegated by the Lodge chief, advisors or Executive committee.

VICE CHIEF FOR COMMUNICATIONS

1. In consultation with the Lodge Chief and the advisors shall be responsible for the Smoke Signal, social media posts and candidate letters for the lodge.
2. Helps create and administer social media sites, web sites and any communication going out to membership, council or section people.
3. Responsible for records of comments, and every week updates to every site.
4. Helps with the annual budget for the lodge.
5. Will make an annual report to the lodge and the council.
6. Will help with the Smoke Signal and other publications.
7. Is responsible for all duties delegated by the Lodge chief, advisors or the Executive committee.

VICE CHIEF FOR CEREMONIES

1. In consultation with the Lodge chief and the advisors shall be responsible for the troop elections, ordeal—brotherhood and vigil ceremonies.
2. Will help form and with help of advisors to train ceremonies teams to conduct ceremonies throughout the year.
3. Help with unit elections, call out ceremonies and Ordeal—Brotherhood—Vigil inductions.
4. Helps with the annual budget for the lodge.
5. Will help with the smoke signal and other publications.
6. Plan research and organize purchase of new ceremony regalia which includes head dresses, costumes ceremony books, sand paintings etc.
7. Is responsible for all duties delegated by the Lodge chief, advisors or the Executive committee.

All Troops with Arrowmen should have a youth OA Troop Representative.



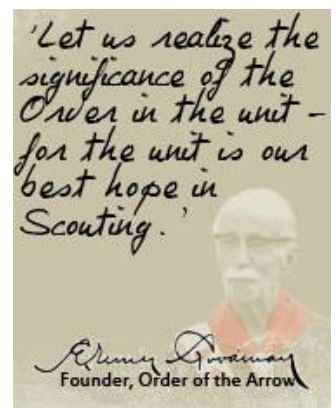
