What will you learn on the road to Eagle Scout?

Outdoors – You will learn to handle yourself in the outdoors.

- Learn how to camp, swim, hike, use wood tools, build a fire, use a camp stove, and find your way with a map and compass.
- Go on camping, hiking, backpacking, and canoe trips.

Conservation - You will learn to be comfortable with nature.

- Learn the causes of pollution in water, land, and air, and spend at least 8 hours working on conservation projects.
- Learn the principals of “Leave No Trace” & “Reduce, Reuse, and Recycle.”

Preparedness - You will learn to embody the Scout motto, “Be Prepared.”

- Learn how to treat fractures, head injuries, hypothermia, convulsions, frostbite, burns, abdominal pain, muscle cramps, and even knocked-out teeth.
- Learn what to do in case of a fire, storm, power outage, and water outage.
- Learn how to swim safely and learn how to rescue a subject.

Life Skills - You will learn how to manage your money.

- Understand the risks and benefits of putting your money in savings bonds, mutual funds, common stock, and real estate, set financial goals and work towards them.
- Learn how to be a good family member, and learn how to talk about finances, drug abuse, and growing up.

Personal Fitness - You will learn how to set and work toward fitness goals.

- Develop aerobic endurance, flexibility, and muscular strength.
- Learn what it means to be physically, mentally, and emotionally fit.

Citizenship & Community Service - You will learn to be a good citizen.

- Learn about the U.S. government and other country and city governments.
- Volunteer at least 28 hours for different charitable organizations.

Leadership - You will learn how to be a good leader.

- Serve actively in the troop for at least 16 months in leadership positions.
- Lead an Eagle Service Project where you will plan, develop, and give leadership to others in a project helpful to your community.
