

Eagle Scout Application Rank Attachments Gateway Council Help File

The information and statements that you add in attachments are very important to help the board of review understand you and ask you good questions. The amount of time that you have with them will be limited, so statements that describe your interests and career ambitions are very important.

The scout must include The Scout's Statement of Ambitions and Life Purpose which can be as short or long as the scout wishes; it should describe the scout's vision of their future and can be a good place to describe how their scouting experience has shaped that vision.

The scout should include a Listing of Positions Held or significant activities in your religious institution, school, camp, community, or other organizations, during which you demonstrated leadership skills. Include honors and awards received during this service.

A significant activity can be any experience important to the scout that will help the board understand their life and character. This can also be a good place to describe the scout's religious activity, service, or faith influence on their life vision, if not expressed elsewhere. Reflecting on the scout oath and law points may help the scout to do this: "On my Honor, I will do my best to do my duty to God", "A Scout is Reverent toward God.", "A Scout is faithful in his religious duties.", "A Scout respects the beliefs of others."

How the scout chooses to present themselves to the board can be a very strong statement of character and maturity. The scout, as an eagle candidate, has the most control over their message to the board in the eagle scout application attachments.

You can make the Board of Review a wonderful experience !

Here are some questions to reflect on that may help you write a statement to the board that will help them understand you.

What activities do you most like to do? How does this affect your vision of the future?

What activities do you like that show your skills or strengths the best?

What are the situations that you most like to work with other people?

Is there a school subject that you would like to take more classes in?

When jobs or careers that you know about include activities that you are interested in doing?

Can you describe your vision of the future in terms of helping people and using your skills?

What have you learned in scouting activities that will help you in the future?

What do you want your future career to be?
