## **LETTER FROM CHIEF PIERCE NELSON**

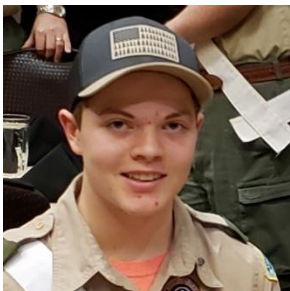


Hello Fellow Arrowmen,

## 2020 LODGE YEAR IN REVIEW

2020 was a challenging year for everyone. Because of COVID-19, many of our events were canceled or altered but our Lodge enjoyed a year of very special events and accomplishments.

1. Members packed 200 lunches for the participants of the council's merit badge day. 20 members came to camp to participate in our Winter Wing Ding and then went to the Merit Badge Day.
2. 55 people came to our Winter Banquet and were treated to a night of recognitions, reports, and were treated to Mr. Rick Cleveland and the Bear Clan Singers and Dancers, who shared the history of the Ho-Chunk nation, their dances, and songs.
3. The lodge was a part of the Camp Decorah summer camp program and worked with units and scouts for ice cream socials, Brotherhood talks, Call Out ceremonies, service projects, and scouting promotions.
4. During our Induction weekend, 28 new Ordeal members were welcomed into the Lodge. 12 members completed their Brotherhood, two members became Vigil Honor members, and 75 people attended the steak dinner.
5. 15 members took part in the Virtual Section Conclave. The 2021 conclave will be held at Camp Decorah in September.
6. The lodge held a new event called "SASH BASH" where 27 members came out to Camp for a day of fun and fellowship. Everyone participated in the zip line, shooting sports, climbing tower, games, and fishing. Everyone closed the day with a trout dinner.
7. The lodge had its Snack Shack as part of the Councils Spook-o-Ree, which the funds raised will be used to purchase new regalia for our ceremonies team and for the future update of the OA Lodge.
8. Lodge members helped with many service projects at camp throughout the year. Projects like, cutting trees, trail cleaning, campsite repairs, event help and serving as staff for council events.



## SECTION CONCLAVE 2021 – SEPTEMBER 17-19



The Section C-1B Conclave will be held at Camp Decorah on September 17 - 19, 2021. Ni-Sanak-Tani Lodge will be co-hosting the conclave with Blue Ox Lodge out of Rochester. ## BROTHERHOOD REQUIREMENTS

- a. Scouters have been an Ordeal Member at least 6 months since their Induction into the OA.
- b. Has maintained registration in the Boy Scouts of America and has paid dues for 2021 to the Lodge and is active.
- c. Has memorized the Obligation, OA song, Admonition, Arrow hand clasp and the sign of the Order.
- d. Take part in the Oral Brotherhood Talk at camp or write a letter showing why you feel you are prepared for the Brotherhood.
- e. If you write a letter---explain what you think the Obligation means. Describe how you have used your understanding of the Ordeal to aid in your service to scouting and the Lodge. Describe your specific plans for giving future service to Scouting and the Lodge.

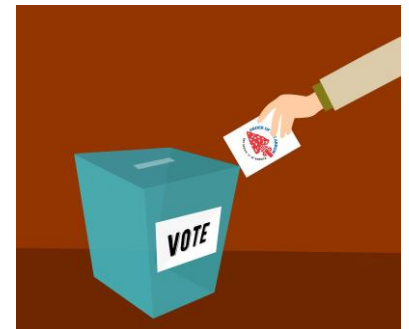


We will be inviting parents and guests to come and witness the ceremony and stay for a steak dinner on Saturday night. Cost will be \$10 per person. There will be a short meeting for all guests at 4:30 PM in Dahl Hall. Guests can watch the Ordeal ceremony. **ABSOLUTELY NO CAMERAS OR VIDEO RECORDING DURING THE CEREMONY**, but they can take as many pictures as they want after.

## UNIT ELECTIONS & CAMP PROMOTIONS

Elections can be held in person or by virtual zoom meeting. Our lodge will help units with either kind of election they choose. Our team will help conduct the voting, talk about the OA, answer questions, and fill out paperwork.

We are planning a CALL OUT ceremony at the Council Spring Camporee or can be done at Camp Decorah during summer camp. Elected candidates will be invited to our Induction weekends on either June 4 - 5 or August 20 - 22.



### Qualifications:

- a. A Scout who holds the First Class rank or a Venturer who has earned the Discoverer award and Sea Scout with the Ordinary rank, is under the age of 21, and is a registered Active member of the troop/crew/ship, with the approval of their unit leader, can be nominated for election. Prior to the election, the unit leader must certify the nominees Scout Spirit and youth membership qualifications.
- b. Each Troop/Crew/Ship candidate must experience 15 nights and days of Scout camping during the two-year period to the election. The 15 nights must include one, but no more than one, long term camp consisting of at least six days with five consecutive nights of overtime camping, approved under the auspices and standards of the BSA. The balance of the camping must be overnight, weekend or other short-term camps. Ship nights may be counted as camping for Sea Scouts

Any Adults (21 and older) who meet the camping requirements may be selected and nominated to join the OA. The nomination needs to be approved by the Lodge Adult selection committee.

The Lodge is also available to give your unit a camp promotion to let you know what is happening at Camp Decorah this summer. The new leaders guide, and video are available to use. This year's camp program will feature new merit badges, new enhancements, updated programs, and the emphasis on our theme at Camp – "If it isn't fun, it isn't Scouting!!"

## **OA TEMPORARY CAMPING REQUIREMENTS FOR 2021**

The following temporary modifications to the Camping Requirements will be in effect until further notice!

VIRTUAL (short term) camping. (backyard or solo camping) may be counted toward the required nights of camping for OA eligibility if all the following stipulations are met:

- a. All virtual camping nights should be a direct result of the Covid-19 pandemic restrictions and be part of a BSA unit-organized unit camping event where members of the unit are involved and camping simultaneously at remote locations.
- b. Some form of unit-organized communications should occur either during or immediately following the event.
- c. All existing youth protection policies and digital safety guidelines should be followed.
- d. No more than three (3) nights of virtual camping are to be credited in any month in which government- or- council- imposed COVID-19 restrictions are in place.

VIRTUAL long-term camping of five (5) consecutive nights is authorized to be counted toward the long-term camping requirements for OA eligibility consistent with the above guidance and the following additional guidelines:

- a. A long term camp plan must be developed and approved by the unit leader prior to the commencement of the long term camp. This plan is to be individualized to each Scouts capabilities and situation and should strive to include:
- b. Progress toward advancement for each Scout.
- c. Outdoor relevant experience consistent with local conditions and restrictions.
- d. Unit organized communications should occur on a daily basis during the camping experience and include discussion of progress made on summer camp goals.
- e. An end-of-camp assessment must be conducted with the unit leader to report on progress made during the experience itself and discuss how future virtual-long term camping experiences can be enhanced. During this assessment, the leader will determine if the scout's participation warrants credit for the completed long term camping experience in terms of OA eligibility.

### CHANGES IN THE OA ELECTION ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS FOR THE CALENDAR YEAR OF 2021 ELECTION CYCLE ONLY!!

- a. The limitation on counting no more than three (3) nights of short term camping in a single month is increased to five (5) nights per month. All other requirements for virtual short term camping eligibility remain in effect.
- b. The requirement for a long term camp of five (5) consecutive nights is relaxed. While council long term camps should be utilized if available, any combination of short term and/or long term nights, in camp or virtual, that are part of a BSA unit-organized unit camping event held within the two years prior to election may be counted toward the 15 night requirement.
- c. In cases where lodges have already begun their 2021 election cycle:
- d. Units which have already held a 2021 election are authorized to hold one additional election.
- e. Only individuals who were ineligible at the time of the first election due to the camping requirement then in effect can be eligible for the second election.
- f. To be eligible, the scout must have met the revised requirements at the time of their unit's election.
- g. The second election must be completed no later than May 1, 2021.

Congratulations goes out to Mr. Tim Mading, who was awarded the Silver Beaver at the Council Recognition Event. The Lodge wants to recognize Tim along with the council for all he does for his Crew, the Lodge, and Scouting.

Mr. Kelly Wilde will be back at Camp Decorah this summer as the Camp Director and he is looking for great staff members and anyone interested in being a Counselor in Training. The Lodge will also be looking for someone to be on staff as the OA coordinator. This person will be responsible for OA ceremonies, elections, promotions, ice cream socials, Brotherhood talks, OA Day, and other assigned activities. Some of the projects will dropping and cutting up trees, clearing paths, splitting wood, brush clearing, OA Bowl cleaning and other small projects. Lunch will be served by the lodge.

## **OA LODGE UPGRADE REPORT**

The Lodge Executive Committee (LEC) is working with the Council and the Ranger Corp to put together a plan for the upgrade of the OA Lodge. Through the fundraising efforts of the lodge over the years, we do have money set aside for these projects. We will be doing our upgrades in phases and will need to help of our members and friends to get them done. Information will be coming to everyone soon.

Here are a few of the suggested phases being estimated:

- a. Replace inside ceiling with new panels and new LED lighting
- b. Dig away dirt from the outside foundation for better drainage and prevent rotting of the outside wood siding.
- c. Paint and stain outside siding.
- d. Evaluate and fix fireplace.
- e. Stain the wood siding inside the lodge.
- f. Remove mattress trailer and build a new storage building
- g. Upgrade the office and kitchen area
- h. Investigate and get estimates on putting water back into the lodge
- i. Investigate doors and windows for replacement or new calking etc.
