Why Camp Close?

Two things we commonly hear from Troops throughout the year — “I am having trouble keeping my Scouts engaged in Scouting with all of the other activities available” and “I am having trouble getting parents to help out”.

Camping close to home at Camp Decorah can help both of these issues.

If needed — *and a full continuous week of Camp is always preferred*— Scouts can depart a local camp occasionally to participate in other commitments. This isn't possible if you are hours away from home. The Scout who gets 85% of a week of Camp Decorah will be further ahead than the Scout who misses his or her summer camp week altogether.

Camping close to home can also facilitate adults from your unit being able to come out to Camp for partial weeks. Time and time again, we have seen a few days at camp be the ‘secret sauce’ that helps to move someone from being a parent off to the side in to being an active volunteer.
